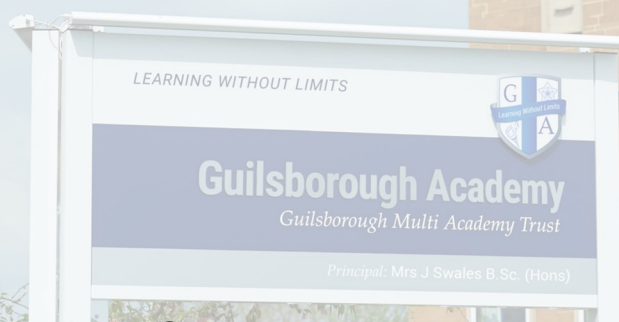


Guilsborough Governor Vacancies
