EDUCATIONAL TRIP PATHFINDERS

Tuesday 10th September saw the biggest Guilsborough cohort yet attend the 'Pathfinders' university discovery trip. Participants join two events each year across Year 9, 10 and 11.

This month's trip was to Lincoln and had a healthcare focus. Students engaged in lectures about DNA, had a go at some medical situational judgement scenarios, got to quiz current students, and toured the teaching facilities which included some amazing dummies and replica medical kit.

Year 11 history students went on a school trip to Hardwick Hall to study for their site question for their GCSE. Here's a write-up from some students...




Firstly, we went on a tour around Hardwick Hall, exploring and seeing the history of Bess of Hardwick and her house. We went around all the rooms, learning about Elizabethan life and seeing how the wealthy lived. The tour guides were very helpful and told us information about Bess and the house; such as the blue room being the most haunted in the house and the windows costing half the price of the house! Also, her love for tapestry was shown throughout the house, and it demonstrated her knowledge, education and wealth by showing classical and mythical figures and women of power. We then ventured through the impressive gardens, with acres of land, an orchard and many spectacular statues which helped create the atmosphere of the Elizabethan era and allowed us to imagine what Bess' life was like. Bess was an inspiring business woman and friend of Queen Elizabeth I, and she owned all the material businesses that built her house. As you drove in, you could see the ruins of her old family home and even though the structure was gone, you could still sense the character of the building. Overall, the trip was insightful and interesting, and the National Trust has kept the life of the building from hundreds of years ago, preserving the old artefacts. The staff were very helpful in answering any and all questions we had and made the trip very educational.

ATTENDANCE UPDATE

A message from the Local Authority regarding updates to attendance procedures

Re: National Framework for Penalty Notices for school absence

I am taking this opportunity to write to inform you of some important changes the Government are introducing regarding school attendance and the issuing of penalty notices when children are absent from school.

A new National Framework for Penalty Notices is being introduced. The regulations will come into effect from the 19th of August 2024. The aim is to improve consistency in the use of penalty notices across England.

The national framework includes:

- A single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) for any unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. The 10-week period may span different terms or school years. For example, 2 sessions of unauthorised absence in the summer term and a further 8 within the autumn term.
- An increase to the rate of a penalty notice from £120 to £160 if paid within 28 days and £60 to £80 if paid within 21 days. If a second penalty notice is issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, the notice will be charged at the higher rate of £160 with no option for this second offence to be discharged at the lower rate of £80.
- A national limit of 2 penalty notices that can be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another tool must be considered (such as prosecution or another attendance legal interventions).

West Northamptonshire Council is in the process of consulting with schools to develop a revised local code of conduct. The document will be published on West Northamptonshire Council's website following the consultation.

We will be amending our School's Attendance Policy in line with the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, a copy can be found on our website.

We believe good attendance is essential to support your child in getting the most out of their education and we thank you for your continued support.





Dear Parent/Guardian

IFG proudly serves over 500,000 students nutritious meals each day. Our award-winning teams are dedicated to serving vibrant, appetising food, freshly prepared on site using quality ingredients. To enable us to continue to do this, our **tariff will increase by an average of 2.0%** across our range from September 2024. Below we have outlined some of the cost pressures which have driven this increase.

Food Inflation: As is the case for supermarkets and restaurants across the UK, the rate at which food prices are rising has slowed, however, they remain high. Coupled with climbing fuel costs, we continue to encounter supply chain challenges such as lack of availability and higher prices.

Employee Funding & Retention: In April, the Government increased the minimum wage by 10%, a positive move which will ease cost pressures for many of our colleagues. Alongside this, to retain and attract a high standard of leadership, we have increased wages for supervisory and managerial roles. Despite positive advancements, the combination of these factors means significant ongoing cost demands across our industry, many of which we have absorbed. Our agility has enabled us to avoid an April increase and keep our September increase down to 2.0%, which is notably lower than the current rate of inflation.

We continue to seek ways of reducing these challenges, however, we refuse to compromise on ingredients or service standards. We remain proud to serve a home cooked main meal and dessert, and several alternative meal deal combinations. Additionally, our free porridge provision at breakfast time, meal deals and new 'PowerBites' range at £1.30 are all designed to provide further support and/or more affordable meal options to ensure nutritious food is always accessible. We truly believe we offer students innovative dishes which rival the high street whilst providing families with great value for money.

Through partnering with schools, we continue to see more students enjoying our services. Whilst this is great news and tells us our menus are popular with students, we are always looking to encourage more young people to dine with us. If you have any feedback we would love to hear from you.

We hope you understand our position and your family can continue to enjoy our services. We remain open and honest about our challenges and will continue to seek your input. Should you wish to discuss this letter, or anything else relating to your catering service, please get in touch.
